



2015 Tomato Variety List

Indeterminate: Tomato varieties that blossom and set tomatoes progressively, the harvest lasts for several months until the plants are killed by a freeze. These varieties are best when staked or caged.

Determinate: Tomato varieties that are space-saving or bush type in the garden. Plants blossom and develop tomatoes on the vine at the same time. Tomatoes produced over a 4-6 week period. Best to stake or cage these varieties. Consider this type if you want a concentrated tomato set for canning.

Slicing Tomato Varieties

Beefmaster Hybrid VFNASt—(80 Days) Indeterminate. Popular hybrid beefsteak type, good disease resistance, solid, meaty tomatoes up to 2#. Resists cracking.

Beefy Boy Hybrid VFFTSt—(70 Days) Indeterminate. Meaty, extra-large main-season beefsteak type with a great taste. Solid 12-16 oz. deep red tomatoes. Heavy yields. KSU recommended.

Better Boy Hybrid VFNASt—(75 Days) Indeterminate. Great midseason variety, deep red tomatoes up to 1#. Juicy, yet firm tomatoes. Excellent disease resistance.

Better Bush VFFNASt—(68 Days) Indeterminate Short Internode. Compact, bushy growth habit. Produces 4" tomatoes weighing 8-10 oz. Excellent choice for large containers or the small garden.

Big Beef Hybrid VFFNTAST—(73 Days) Indeterminate. Old fashioned rich flavor with bred-in hybrid qualities of large tomato size, good yields, uniformity and good disease resistance.

Burpee's Big Boy—(78 Days) Indeterminate. Large, crack-free tomatoes with absolute superb flavor. Bright red, firm, meaty tomatoes grow to 1# or more in size.

Bush Early Girl Hybrid VFFNT—(54 Days) Determinate. Compact, patio-sized variety. Produces huge yields of firm, meaty, flavorful tomatoes.

Celebrity Hybrid VFFNTAST—(70 Days) Determinate. All America Selection Award winner. Produces medium-sized globe-shaped tomatoes that are crack resistant and average 7 oz. Recommended by KSU.

Champion Hybrid VFNT—(62 Days) Indeterminate. One of the earliest full-sized tomatoes. Flavorful and prolific producer of 6-8 oz. round tomatoes that are solid, meaty and very sweet.

Early Cascade Hybrid VASt—(50 Days) Indeterminate. Strong cascading plants produce clusters of smooth, red 4 oz. tomatoes all summer. Fine flavor, use fresh or canned.

Early Girl Hybrid VFF—(57 Days) Indeterminate. Meaty, tasty 4-6 oz. tomatoes that have a firm texture, blemish resistant skin. Heavy yields.

Fourth of July—(49 Days) Indeterminate. A Burpee Exclusive Variety. Produces tasty tomatoes that are big enough for slicing, juicy yet firm. Perfect for summer picnics. Grow to 2.5" across. Gives you the first tomato!

Goliath Hybrid VFFASt—(65 Days) Indeterminate. Smooth bright-red, deep oblate tomatoes that average 10-15 oz. with sweet luscious flavor and a high yield producer.

Goliath Bush Hybrid VFN—(68 Days) Determinate. Perfect for the patio gardeners or those with limited space. Grows 3.5' tall, producing 3-4" tomatoes that are flavorful, and high sugar content.

Goliath Early Hybrid VFFNTASt—(58 Days) Indeterminate. A variety that produces tomatoes with superb size, perfect shape, continuous production, luscious flavor and broad disease resistance.

Health Kick Hybrid VFFASt—(72 Days) Determinate. The perfect saladette variety—fine flavored, juicy plum-shaped tomatoes. Has 50% more lycopene content than other garden varieties. High yields.

Heirloom Marriage Hybrid Big Brandy—(75 Days) Indeterminate. All the flavor, higher yields and earlier than traditional heirloom tomatoes. A cross between "Big Dwarf" x "Brandywine", produces a pink beefsteak tomato.

Heirloom Marriage Hybrid Genuwine—(75 Days) Indeterminate. All the flavor, higher yields and earlier than traditional heirloom tomatoes. A cross between "Costolute Genovese" x "Brandywine", produces a 10-12 oz. flat scarlet tomato with terrific taste.

Homeslice Hybrid VF—(63 Days) Determinate. A round-shaped red slicer that has true tomato flavor. Early, very productive with a smaller growth habit making it perfect for smaller gardens and containers.

Jet Star Hybrid VF—(70 Days) Indeterminate. Prolific producer of big, globe-shaped tomatoes. Excellent flavor with low acidity. Very good crack resistance. Recommended by KSU.

Jetsetter Hybrid VFN—(66 Days) Indeterminate. A hybrid that may be better than Jet Star. Produces a round red 8 oz. tomato. Sets tomatoes continuously till frost. Recommended by KSU.

Lemon Boy Hybrid—(72 Days) Indeterminate. Produces lemon yellow tomatoes, with a mild flavor. Large, deep oblate tomatoes average 6-7 oz. This tomato adds an inviting color to salads.

Mega Bite Hybrid—(60 Days) Determinate. Produces large 4" beefsteak type tomatoes on compact bushy plants that are perfect for the patio, or in a large container. Grows only 14' tall. Prolific producer.

Mountain Fresh Plus Hybrid VFF—(79 Days) Determinate. Produces medium to large 8-10 oz. tomatoes with superior flavor and resists cracking. Recommended by KSU.

Mountain Merit Hybrid VFN—(75 Days) Determinate. All America Selections winner 2014. Nice all-around tomato, excellent late blight resistance. Produces 3.5" tomatoes, mild-flavored. Perfect slicer.

Mountain Spring Hybrid VFF—(69 Days) Determinate. Excellent resistance to cracking and blossom end rot. Produces large, firm 9 oz. deep globed shaped tomatoes. Recommended by KSU.

Orange Wellington Hybrid VF—(75 Days) Indeterminate. A Burpee Exclusive Variety. Bursting with flavor, here is a tomato you'll want with every meal. Hardy, prolific plants bear meaty, nearly seedless 12 oz. tomatoes, that are orange in color, from mid to late season.

Park's Whopper Hybrid VFFNT—(65 Days) Indeterminate. Excellent disease and crack resistance. Produces nice, smooth 12 oz. or larger tomatoes.

Patio Hybrid VF—(65 Days) Determinate. Great for containers or small space gardening. Grows 2' tall. Produces bunches of firm, round red 3 oz. tomatoes.

Rutgers VFASt—(75 Days) Indeterminate. An all-purpose variety that is ideal for canning. Attractive, old-time favorite. Full-bodied flavor and disease resistance.

SteakHouse Hybrid—(75-80 Days) Indeterminate. A Burpee Exclusive Variety. Meet the biggest tomato ever bred. It tips the scales up to 3#. A super tomato in every way. Broad-shouldered, loaded with true heirloom tomato flavor and head-spinning fragrance.

Super Fantastic Hybrid VFN—(70 Days) Indeterminate. Produces heavy yields of solid, meaty, smooth tomatoes that weight 10 oz. each. Excellent for canning.

Supersonic Hybrid VF—(75 Days) Indeterminate. Big, 6-8 oz. tomatoes with flavor and quality. Firm, meaty, and crack-resistant. High yields.

Supersteak Hybrid VFN—(80 Days) Indeterminate. A favorite among many gardeners. Produces smooth, meaty tomatoes up to 2# that are perfect for sandwiches—one slice covers the whole thing.

Paste Tomato Varieties

Big Mama Hybrid—(80 Days) Indeterminate. A Burpee Exclusive Variety. Produces enormous meaty tomatoes up to 5"x 3", that are practically seedless, weigh 4-6 oz. each that are perfect for tasty sauces.

Fresh Salsa Hybrid VFN—(65-75 Days) Determinate. A Burpee Exclusive Variety. The ideal tomato for tasty salsas, bruschetta and light sauces. Chopped into tiny cubes it remains firm and solid. Sweet, plum-shaped 4 oz. tomatoes.

Polish Linguisa—(73 Days) Indeterminate. Produces huge 9 oz. sausage shaped tomatoes. Delicious fresh or in sauces, a heavy producer.

Roma VFA—(75 Days) Determinate. The most well-known paste-type tomato, perfect for sauces, pastes and ketchup. Produces red, pear-shaped, meaty tomatoes. Recommended by KSU.

Sausage—(75 Days) Indeterminate. Unusual shaped tomatoes 6” long, similar to huge, red banana peppers. Fine-flavored paste, ideal for sauces or ketchup. Good producer.

Super Marzano Hybrid VFNTA—(90 Days) Indeterminate. A giant pear-type, with tomatoes that are high in pectin, giving sauces and pastes a natural thickness. Produces 4 oz. tomatoes that are 5” long. Recommended by KSU.

SuperSauce Hybrid—(70 Days) Indeterminate. A Burpee Exclusive Variety. A whole lot bigger, a whole lot better---a roma with aroma! Produces an average 2# tomato that is 5.5” x 5”. Perfect for a luscious, seedless sauce. Disease resistant.

Viva Italia Hybrid VFFNAST—(70 Days) Determinate. A hybrid paste tomato with great disease resistance. Classic, blocky pear shape. Exceptionally high yields.

Cherry Tomato Varieties

Black Cherry Hybrid—(67 Days) Indeterminate. Produces high yields of great tasting dark purple cherry tomatoes.

Chocolate Cherry—(70 Days) Indeterminate. Produces clusters of chocolate-colored 1-2” round or oblong tomatoes, highly flavorful with thin skin and smooth texture.

Husky Cherry Red Hybrid VFA—(65 Days) Determinate. An all season long producer of 1” tomatoes with excellent flavor. Perfect for small spaces or large containers.

Lizzano Hybrid—(63 Days) A patio-type variety with snack-sized cherry tomatoes 1” in diameter. Plants grow 16”-20” tall and 20” wide. Excellent for large hanging baskets, or large containers.

Power Pops Hybrid—(45 Days) Indeterminate. A Burpee Exclusive Variety. Great early variety that produces a cherry tomato with 55% more lycopene and 40% more carotenoids than the average garden tomato. Good yields.

Sugary Hybrid—(80 Days) Determinate. All American Selection award winner. Super-sweet juicy 2 oz. tomatoes. Oval-shaped, reddish pink, slightly pointed tomatoes. Sets tomatoes continuously.

Sungold Hybrid—(58 Days) Indeterminate. Positively luscious, bite-sized golden beauties! Thin skinned, extra sweet, very early and a heavy producer. Recommended by KSU.

Supersweet 100 Hybrid VF—(65 Days) Indeterminate. Produces long strands of 100 or more super-sweet cherry tomatoes, weighing 1 oz. Extra high in Vitamin C. Recommended by KSU.

Sweet ‘N Neat Scarlet Hybrid—(60 Days) Determinate. A hard-working patio tomato, just 10”-12” tall. A plant that produces masses of red juicy-sweet 1 oz. cherry tomatoes all summer long. Need to support.

Sweet ‘N Neat Yellow Hybrid—(60 Days) Determinate. A hard-working patio tomato, just 10”-12” tall. A plant that produces masses of yellow juicy-sweet 1 oz. cherry tomatoes all summer long. Need to support.

Sweet Treats Hybrid FT—(70 Days) Indeterminate. A large pink cherry tomato with exceptionally good eating qualities—a good balance of sweetness and acidity.

Tomatoberry Garden Hybrid FNT—(80 Days) Indeterminate. A unique 1” strawberry-shaped tomato that has a super-sweet taste and aroma. Produces high yields of shiny, deep red, one-bite tomatoes.

Yellow Pear—(78 Days) Indeterminate. Vigorous vines produce high yields of 1” yellow-skinned, pear-shaped tomatoes with few seeds. Dependable performance.

Grape Tomato Varieties

Cupid Hybrid FASt—(66 Days) Indeterminate. A very sweet tasting 1” tomato that resists cracking and holds up well after harvest.

Idle—(53 Days) Indeterminate. A yellow grape tomato that is early, high-yielding and delicious. Tomatoes are produced in large clusters, and has a great staying power on the vine or after picking.

Juliet Hybrid—(60 Days) Indeterminate. All America Selections winner. A larger grape tomato that does not crack. Produces clusters of sweet-flavored tomatoes all summer. Great snacking tomato. Recommended by KSU.

Fantastico—(50 Days) Determinate. All America Selections winner 2014. Produces up to 350 flavorful grape tomatoes per plant in long clusters. Excellent disease tolerance to late blight.

Red Grape—(60 Days) Indeterminate. Small, oval-shaped tomatoes that are firm, meaty, sweet, with few seeds. Produces clusters of 20 or more tomatoes.

Heirloom Tomato Varieties

Abe Lincoln—(87 Days) Indeterminate. Produces dark red tomatoes that are sweet, solid and meaty. Good crack resistance.

Arkansas Traveler—(80-90 Days) Indeterminate. Produces smooth rose-colored tomatoes with mild flavor, are juicy and heat and humidity tolerant. Good disease and crack resistance.

Black From Tula—(75 Days) Indeterminate. Produces a red-brown beefsteak tomato, smooth, 10 oz., very tasty, sets well even in the heat. A Russian heirloom.

Black Krim—(69 Days) A most unusual novelty. Produces tomatoes that are dark deep red (almost a shiny black) with heavy green shoulders. Sweet and tasty.

Brandywine Pink—(90-100 Days) Indeterminate. An Amish heirloom variety that dates back to 1885. The leaves look like potato vines. Good yields, produces 1.5# light rosy pink tomatoes.

Brandywine Yellow—(90-100 Days) Indeterminate. The golden yellow version of the Brandywine family. Produces prolific yields of flattened, semi-irregular tomatoes.

Caspian Pink—(80 Days) Indeterminate. This variety may have a taste that is better than Brandywine! Produces tomatoes with thin, light red skin and is very juicy and very flavorful.

Cherokee Purple—(80-90 Days) Indeterminate. A reliable producer of unusual, medium pink-purple tomatoes that appear brown in color. Tomatoes average 8-12 oz. and are very flavorful.

German's Johnson—(80 Days) Indeterminate. Produces large, rough tomatoes averaging 1.5# with pink skin and yellow shoulders. Very mild in flavor, low acid, meaty and heavy yields.

Giant Belgium Pink--(80 Days) Indeterminate. Produces huge, sweet tomatoes that average 1-2#. Tomatoes are dark pink, low in acid with mild flavor and very solid. Solid meat and size means one slice per sandwich!

Mortgage Lifter—(75-85 Days) Indeterminate. A long-time favorite with good yields of very large, smooth pink-skinned tomatoes. Very meaty, mild sweet flavor with few seeds.

Mr. Stripy—(80 Days) Indeterminate. Produces red and yellow-striped tomatoes that add color to any gourmet salad. Large, ridge-shouldered tomatoes are mild-flavored, low in acid.

Pineapple—(85 Days) Indeterminate. Produces a large, beefsteak-type tomato that ripens to a beautiful bright yellow, often with red stripes, meaty, mild-flavored with few seeds. High yields.
