

Tomato Variety List 2022

Indeterminate: Tomato varieties that should be staked, trellised, or caged for best results. Indeterminate tomatoes produce large vines and bear fruit through the season except when hot summer temperatures prevent pollination and fruit formation.

Determinate: Tomato varieties that are space-saving or bush type in the garden. They may be grown with or without support. Determinate tomatoes produce most of their fruit early and less later. Consider some varieties of this type if you want a supply of ample amounts of tomatoes for canning.

Disease Resistance Codes

V – Verticillium Wilt; F - Fusarium Wilt; N – Nematodes; T – Tobacco Mosaic Virus; A – Alternaria Stem Canker

St – Stemphylium Grey Leaf Spot; TSWV – Tomato Spotted Wilt Virus; YLCV – Yellow Leaf Curl Virus;

BS – Bacterial Speck; EB – Early Blight;

LB – Late Blight; (Note that even resistant varieties may need preventative fungicide application especially in wet seasons)

Slicing Tomato Varieties

Beefmaster Hybrid VFNASt—(80 Days) Indeterminate. Popular hybrid beefsteak type, good disease resistance, solid, meaty tomatoes up to 2#. Resists cracking and splitting.

<u>Better Boy Hybrid VFNAStLB</u>—(75 Days) Indeterminate. Great midseason variety, deep red tomatoes up to 1#. Juicy, yet firm tomatoes. Excellent disease resistance.

<u>Big Beef Hybrid VFFNTASt</u>—(73 Days) Indeterminate. Old fashioned rich flavor with bred-in hybrid qualities of large, smooth tomato, good size, weighing 9-16 oz. Good yields, uniformity and disease resistance. Recommended by KSU

<u>Buffalosun Hybrid LBTSWV</u>—(70 Days) Indeterminate. Produces large yields with less cracking. A unique yellow with red/orange flame coloration with a marbled interior. Good tasting, not mushy and meaty. Good Late Blight Resistance.

Burpee's Big Boy—(78 Days) Indeterminate. Large, crack-free tomatoes with absolute superb flavor. Bright red, firm, meaty tomatoes grow to 1# or more in size, with smooth blemish-resistant skins.

<u>Carmello Hybrid VFN TMV</u>--(75 Days) Indeterminate. A beautiful French variety with good sugar to acid balance and crack resistant skin. Produces a 10-12 oz. red slicing tomato.

<u>Celebrity Hybrid VFFNTASt</u>—(70 Days) Determinate. All America Selection Award winner. Produces mediumsized globe-shaped tomatoes that are crack resistant and average 7 oz. Recommended by KSU.

<u>Chef's Choice Orange Hybrid FTA</u>—(75 Days) Indeterminate. Bred from the popular heirloom variety Amana Orange. Tomatoes have a wonderful flavor, unique bright orange color inside and out. A beefsteak type 5-6" tomato, weighing 9-12 oz. in a flattened globe shape.

Early Cascade Hybrid VASt—(50 Days) Indeterminate. Strong cascading plants produce clusters of smooth, red 4 oz. tomatoes all summer. Fine flavor, use fresh or canned.

Early Girl Hybrid VFF—(57 Days) Indeterminate. Meaty, tasty 4-6 oz. tomatoes that have a firm texture, blemish resistant skin. Heavy yields.

Fourth of July—(49 Days) Indeterminate. <u>Burpee Exclusive Variety</u>. Produces tasty tomatoes that are big enough for slicing, juicy yet firm. Perfect for summer picnics. Grow to 2.5" across. Gives you the first tomato!

<u>Goliath Hybrid VFFASt</u>—(65 Days) Indeterminate. Smooth bright-red, deep oblate tomatoes that average 10-15 oz. with sweet luscious flavor and a high yield producer.

<u>Health Kick Hybrid VFFAStTSWVBS</u>—(72 Days) Determinate. The perfect saladette variety—fine flavored, juicy plum-shaped tomatoes. Has 50% more lycopene content than other garden varieties. High yields.

<u>Jet Star Hybrid VF</u>—(70 Days) Indeterminate. Prolific producer of big, globe-shaped tomatoes. Excellent flavor with low acidity. Very good crack resistance. Recommended by KSU.

<u>Jetsetter Hybrid VFFNTASt</u>—(66 Days) Indeterminate. A hybrid that may be better than Jet Star. Produces a smooth, juicy, flattened globe shaped red 8 oz. tomato. Huge yields. Recommended by KSU.

Lemon Boy Hybrid VFNASt—(72 Days) Indeterminate. Produces lemon yellow tomatoes, with a mild flavor. Large, deep oblate tomatoes average 6-7 oz., about 3.5" across. This tomato adds an inviting color to salads.

<u>Mountain Fresh Plus Hybrid VFFNEB</u>—(79 Days) Determinate. Produces medium to large 8-10 oz. tomatoes with superior flavor and resists cracking. Recommended by KSU.

<u>Park's Whopper Hybrid VFFNT</u>—(65 Days) Indeterminate. Excellent disease and crack resistance. Produces nice, smooth 12 oz. or larger tomatoes.

<u>SteakHouse Hybrid</u>—(75-80 Days) Indeterminate. <u>Burpee Exclusive Variety</u>. Meet the biggest tomato ever bred. It tips the scales up to 3#. A super tomato in every way. Broad-shouldered, loaded with true heirloom tomato flavor and head-spinning fragrance.

<u>Supersonic Hybrid VF</u>—(75 Days) Indeterminate. Big, 6-8 oz. tomatoes with flavor, size and quality. Firm, meaty, and crack-resistant. High yields.

<u>Supersteak Hybrid VFN</u>—(80 Days) Indeterminate. A favorite among many gardeners. Produces smooth, meaty tomatoes up to 2# that are perfect for sandwiches—one slice covers the whole thing.

Space Saving Tomato Varieties

<u>Better Bush VFFNASt</u> –(68 Days) Indeterminate Short Internode. Compact, bushy growth habit. Produces 4" tomatoes weighing 8-10 oz. Excellent choice for large containers or the small garden.

<u>Goliath Bush Hybrid VF</u>—(68 Days) Determinate. Perfect for the patio large container or those with limited space. Grows 3.5' tall, producing 3-4" tomatoes that are flavorful, with high sugar content. Good producer.

Fantastico LB—(50 Days) Determinate. All America Selections winner. Produces up to 350 flavorful grape tomatoes per plant in long clusters. Excellent disease tolerance to late blight. Grows only 15" tall. Perfect for large patio containers or 18" hanging basket, resists cracking.

<u>Grand Slam FNTSWVV</u>—(74 Days) Determinate. <u>Burpee Exclusive Variety</u>. Perfect for patios and large containers as it grows 24"-36" tall and wide. Great tasting 10-12 oz. red slicing tomato. High disease resistance and high-yielding compact variety.

<u>Husky Cherry Red Hybrid VFA</u>—(65 Days) Determinate. An all season long producer of 1" tomatoes with excellent flavor. Perfect for small space gardens or large containers.

<u>Patio Choice Yellow</u>—(50-60 Days) Determinate. Produces generous amounts of 2-3 oz. yellow cherry tomatoes that are juicy, delicious, and perfect for snacking and salads. Plants are compact, and cascading and grow to 24" Good choice for containers or large hanging baskets.

Power Pops Hybrid—(45 Days) Indeterminate. <u>Burpee Exclusive Variety</u>. Great early variety that produces a cherry tomato with 55% more lycopene and 40% more carotenoids than the average garden tomato. Very compact. Good yields. Perfect for containers or large hanging basket.

<u>Sweetheart of the Patio Hybrid LB</u>—(68 Days) Determinate. <u>Burpee Exclusive Variety.</u> Compact plant that is ideal for a container. Produces super-sweet, 1 oz. snack-ready cherry tomatoes all summer long. Late Blight tolerant. Grows 24"-36" tall, 18" spread.

<u>Sweet 'N Neat Scarlet Hybrid</u>—(60 Days) Determinate. A hard-working patio tomato, just 10"-12" tall. A small plant that produces masses of red, juicy, sweet 1 oz. cherry tomatoes all summer long. Grow in a large pot 12"-14" across.

<u>Sweet 'N Neat Yellow Hybrid</u>—(60 Days) Determinate. A hard-working patio tomato, just 10"-12" tall. A compact plant that produces masses of yellow, juicy, sweet 1 oz. cherry tomatoes all summer long. Grow in a large pot 12"-14" across.

Paste Tomato Varieties

<u>Big Mama Hybrid</u>—(80 Days) Indeterminate. <u>Burpee Exclusive Variety</u>. Produces enormous meaty tomatoes up to 5"x 3", that are practically seedless, weigh 4-6 oz. each that are perfect for tasty sauces.

<u>Fresh Salsa Hybrid VFN</u>—(65-75 Days) Determinate. <u>Burpee Exclusive Variety.</u> The ideal tomato for tasty salsas, bruschetta and light sauces. Chopped into tiny cubes it remains firm and solid. Sweet, plum-shaped 4 oz. tomatoes.

<u>Gladiator Hybrid</u>—(72 Days) Indeterminate. A champion with zesty Italian flavor, vigor, aroma and yield. Produces a bounty of oval 8 oz. tomatoes on the patio or small garden. Perfect for sauces, soups and salsa. Resists blight and blossom end rot.

<u>Heirloom Marriage Marzinera</u>—(75 Days) Indeterminate. A red Roma paste type. Produces large yields of meaty tomatoes. A cross between the Heirloom varieties of "San Marzano" and "Cream Sausage". This cross has an improved yield and the old time flavor.

LaRoma Red III Hybrid VFFNASt — (76 Days) Determinate. Excellent roma tomato known for its vigor and uniformity. Bright red, meaty tomatoes are large, 5-8 oz. and full of flavor. Disease resistant plants are vigorous and productive. Perfect for canning and sauces.

<u>Roma VFNA LB</u>—(75 Days) Determinate. The most well-known paste-type tomato, perfect for sauces, pastes and ketchup. Produces red, pear-shaped, 2 oz. meaty tomatoes. Recommended by KSU.

<u>Super Marzano Hybrid VFNTA</u>—(90 Days) Indeterminate. A giant pear-type, with tomatoes that are high in pectin, giving sauces and pastes a natural thickness. Produces 4 oz. tomatoes that are 5" long. Recommended by KSU.

<u>SuperSauce Hybrid</u>—(70 Days) Indeterminate. <u>Burpee Exclusive Variety</u>. A whole lot bigger, a whole lot better---a roma with aroma! Produces an average 2# tomato that is 5.5" x 5". Perfect for a luscious, seedless sauce. Disease resistant.

<u>Viva Italia Hybrid VFFNASt</u>—(70 Days) Determinate. A hybrid Italian type paste tomato with great disease resistance. Classic long oval shape. Exceptional high yields. Tomatoes have high sugar and good acid content.

Small Tomato Varieties

<u>Artemis FFNT</u>—(50-55 Days) Indeterminate. Produces small 1" super-sweet, red cherry tomatoes. Tomatoes have a unique, crisp, firm texture. Perfect for salads and sauces. Plants offer a high resistance to root-zone and foliar disease.

<u>Black Cherry Hybrid</u>—(67 Days) Indeterminate. Produces high yields of great tasting dark purple cherry tomatoes. Perfect for shish-kabobs, salads, or snacking in the garden.

<u>Chocolate Cherry</u>—(70 Days) Indeterminate. Produces clusters of round chocolate-red colored 1" tomatoes, highly flavorful with thin skin and smooth texture. Resists cracking.

<u>Gold Spark</u>—(60 Days) Indeterminate. A great snacking variety. Produces dark yellow grape tomatoes 2" long that are crack resistant, sweet, and meaty.

<u>Golden Sweet</u>—(60 Days) Indeterminate. Produces long clusters of deep yellow grape tomatoes. The tomatoes are firm, crisp, and resist cracking. Excellent producer.

<u>Juliet Hybrid EB</u>—(60 Days) Indeterminate. All America Selection winner. A larger grape tomato that does not crack. Produces clusters of sweet-flavored tomatoes all summer. Great snacking tomato. Recommended by KSU. Resistant to Leaf Spot.

<u>Mountain Magic Cherry VFEBLB</u>—(66 Days) Indeterminate. Produces high yields of 2 oz. bright red, round salad tomatoes with very sweet flavor. Uniform, crack-resistant tomatoes. Great in salads.

<u>**Ruby Crush FTSt**</u>—(60 Days) Determinate. Performs well in containers and the garden. Sugary-acid balanced tomato that resists cracking. Smooth, bright red, solid, oval grape tomato, weighs ½ oz. Compact and strong plants have good leaf coverage.

<u>Sugary Hybrid</u>—(80 Days) Determinate. All America Selection award winner. Super-sweet juicy 2 oz. tomatoes. Oval-shaped, reddish pink, slightly pointed tomatoes. Sets tomatoes continuously.

<u>Sungold Hybrid FTSWV</u>—(58 Days) Indeterminate. Positively luscious, bite-sized golden beauties! Thin skinned, extra sweet, very early and a heavy producer. Recommended by KSU.

<u>Supersweet 100 Hybrid VF</u>—(65 Days) Indeterminate. Produces long strands of 100 or more super-sweet cherry tomatoes, weighing 1 oz. Extra high in Vitamin C. Recommended by KSU.

<u>Sweet Treats Hybrid FFTSt</u>—(70 Days) Indeterminate. A large pink cherry tomato with exceptionally good eating qualities—a good balance of sweetness and acidity. Resists cracking.

<u>Yellow Pear</u>—(78 Days) Indeterminate. Vigorous vines produce high yields of 1" yellow-skinned, pear-shaped tomatoes with few seeds. Dependable performance.

Heirloom Tomato Varieties

<u>Abe Lincoln</u>--(87 Days) Indeterminate. Produces dark red tomatoes that are sweet, solid and meaty. Good crack resistance.

<u>Arkansas Traveler</u>—(80-90 Days) Indeterminate. Produces smooth rose-colored, juicy tomatoes with mild flavor that are heat and humidity tolerant. Good disease and crack resistance.

<u>Black From Tula</u>—(75 Days) Indeterminate. Produces a red-brown beefsteak tomato, smooth, 10 oz., very tasty, sets well even in the heat. A Russian heirloom.

<u>Black Krim LB</u>—(69 Days) A most unusual novelty. Produces tomatoes that are dark deep red (almost a shiny black) with heavy green shoulders, the interior is a deep, reddish-green color. Sweet and tasty. Recommended by KSU

Brandywine Pink EBLB—(90-100 Days) Indeterminate. An Amish heirloom variety that dates back to 1885. The leaves look like potato vines. Good yields, produces 1.5# light rosy pink tomatoes. Considered to be one of the world's best-flavored tomatoes.

<u>Brandywine Yellow</u>—(90-100 Days) Indeterminate. The golden yellow version of the Brandywine family. Produces prolific yields of flattened, semi-irregular tomatoes.

<u>Caspian Pink</u>—(80 Days) Indeterminate. This variety may have a taste that is better than Brandywine! Produces tomatoes with thin, light red skin and is very juicy and very flavorful.

<u>Cherokee Purple</u>—(80-90 Days) Indeterminate. A reliable producer of unusual, medium pink-purple tomatoes that appear brown in color. Tomatoes average 8-12 oz. and are very flavorful. Recommended by KSU.

Delicious—(77 Days) Indeterminate. This variety produces huge, oblate-shaped tomatoes, with of course delicious flavor. Tomatoes are smooth and crack-resistant.

<u>Heirloom Marriage Hybrid Big Brandy</u>—(75 Days) Indeterminate. All the flavor, higher yields and earlier than traditional heirloom tomatoes. A cross between "Big Dwarf" x "Brandywine", produces a pink beefsteak tomato, weighing 12-15 oz.

<u>Heirloom Marriage Hybrid Cherokee Carbon</u>—(75-80 Days) Indeterminate. Cross of two heirloom taste test winners: Cherokee Purple and Carbon. Produces dusty purple beefsteak tomatoes with rich, complex flavor. Higher yields and earlier maturity. This one makes one of the most delicious tomato sandwiches ever!

<u>Heirloom Marriage Hybrid Genuwine</u>—(75 Days) Indeterminate. All the flavor, higher yields and earlier than traditional heirloom tomatoes. A cross between "Costolute Genovese" x "Brandywine", produces a 10-12 oz. flat scarlet tomato with terrific taste.

<u>Mortgage Lifter</u>—(75-85 Days) Indeterminate. A long-time favorite with good yields of very large, smooth pink-skinned tomatoes. Very meaty, mild sweet flavor with few seeds. Recommended by KSU

<u>**Rutgers VFASt</u>**—(75 Days) Indeterminate. An all-purpose variety that is ideal for canning. Attractive, all-time favorite. Full-bodied flavor and disease resistance.</u>
